The teacher has now been trained as a Forest School teacher and we will be working together to develop the OAA activities delivered to students and the	N/A	<p>Forest school are incorporating games into their sessions to keep children active. Most classes are spending a prolonged period of time outside which is leading to higher activity levels.</p> <p>They are aware of how this helps contribute to a healthy body and mind and the Forest school team ensure that they do emotional check ins with the students twice during the sessions.</p> <p>The forest school TA is on the training and is developing his practise in order to offer more activities when this is completed – should be finished by July 2019.</p> <p>I will work more closely with Forest school next year to develop the OAA activities for each year group in line with their appropriate skills.</p> <p>Andy has completed his qualification now so the Forest school team will be more able to further the fundamental movement skills and ensuring healthy body and mind through regular cooking sessions.</p> <p>One of our teachers MH is now fully qualified level 3 Forest school practitioner.</p>
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Stockport County Football Club Coaching.	2, 3, 4, 5	2,4,7, 8	All	Linking with Stockport County Football Club to provide lunchtime activities, once a week, and an afternoon football coaching club twice a week. Football provides essential teamwork, basic skills and improved fitness for all children, specifically the girls we wish to target. Through our redesign of the curriculum this year, football will be offered in KS1, basketball in LKS2 and rugby in UKS2 to develop skills in invasion games.	£8580	<p>Increased cardio levels of all children who have had the sessions so far – many children have been inspired to join the football teams (boys and girls) and we have been to 6 tournaments already.</p> <p>Tuesday lunchtimes are proving a popular activity set for the children so Miss Owen and the lunchtime supervisors are meeting to discuss how we can feed that into the other day’s provision.</p> <p>Have completed an intervention with less active children and this has had a direct effect on the children joining the after school clubs.</p> <p>Stockport County have also offered and completed a free Premier League Primary Stars program with one class and are now using this format to deliver their after school club (this has increased interest and the club is now full – mixture of boys and girls).</p> <p>Stockport County have been a great asset so far with increased participation to sessions.</p> <p>The lunchtime provider has modelled to lunchtime staff how to use the football pitches so we have designed a provision around that system that seems to be working well.</p> <p>Stockport County will continue next year and we will build in more of the sports that staff are not confident with in order to build teachers’ CPD opportunities.</p> <p>Stockport county and teacher LS have set up a football afterschool club every Friday UKS2.</p>
